We were pleased to welcome Thomas Winter, the London District Property co-ordinator to lead a Visioning Session at Streatham in September. Our members contributed their views about the area and the local community, and this has resulted in a new vision statement.

Our Vision for Streatham

Streatham Methodist Church seeks to be a **welcoming, affirming, and prayerful community** — a place of **spiritual growth, peace, and hope** in the heart of Streatham.

Our vision is to share the love and message of Jesus Christ with all people by:

1. Strengthening Community and Fellowship

We will build on our identity as a place of **love, community, and hospitality**, offering a sense of belonging in an area where many experience **isolation, poverty, and homelessness**.

2. Serving as a Spiritual and Physical Hub

We aim to ensure our church is seen as a **vibrant, open, and welcoming space** — a place where people are **fed spiritually and physically**, find **peace**, and receive **kind and practical support**.

3. Being a Justice-Seeking Church

We will actively live out God's call to **seek justice, love mercy, and walk humbly**, caring for those in need and challenging the injustices that affect our local community.

Our Priorities for Mission and Action

To fulfil this vision and deepen our outreach in Streatham we will endeavor to:

- **Improve accessibility**— Continue to develop a **refurbished, healthy, and inclusive** building that meets the needs of all.
- **Make the church more visible and inviting**- Work towards keeping our **main doors open every day**, signalling that SMC is a living, active, and welcoming presence in Streatham.
- **Develop ways to serve the local community** - Deepening collaboration with local organisations and charities.



- Foster **spiritual growth, connection, and fellowship** across all generations:

- Renew our **pastoral care systems** so that everyone feels valued, supported, and connected.

- Encourage opportunities for **shared learning and worship** across generations and nurturing deeper discipleship through Bible study and small groups.

- Continue to offer **vibrant, Spirit-filled worship** that draws on SMC's strong community roots and celebrates the diversity of our congregation.

We have a lot to do to achieve this mission, but we are resolved, with the help of God to try.

Meanwhile we have had a completely new Fire Alarm system installed and a survey of our roof as one of the pinnacles has become unstable. This has led to the fencing off part of the grass area in case the pinnacle falls. We are now actively searching for funding towards the major works that are needed to stop further decay to the stonework and roof. Our church has been on this site since 1900. It is Grade 2 listed and built in Art and Craft Gothic style, it has a wide barrel-vaulted ceiling and beautiful stained-glass windows.

During the Summer we had three break-ins which has meant we have also had to spend a lot of money installing more robust intruder alarms and CCTV.

Our congregation is in good spirits, and we look forward to working with the circuit to continue our work in Streatham and engage more with the local community.

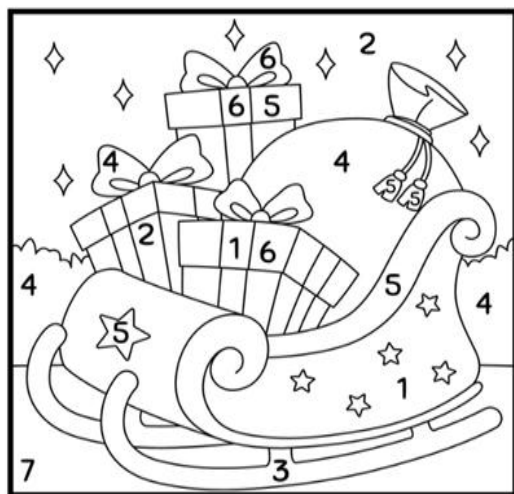
