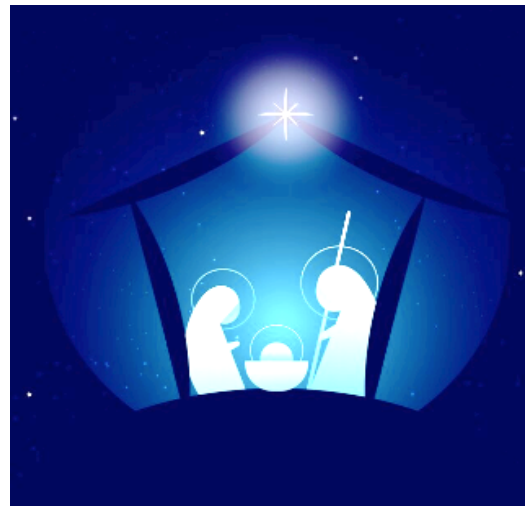
Advent dawns with lights strung high and music everywhere,

Revd Sue Shortman's Message

Dear Lambeth Circuit Family,

I write as I begin to settle into life in the Lambeth Circuit and grapple with the work that God has called me to be here amongst you all. I found myself with feelings of excitement and hope as I visited the site in Vauxhall currently under construction recently a pioneering part of the appointment to which I was stationed here in The Lambeth Circuit. It feels very much like we are embarking on an important journey together—one that has the potential to transform not only our circuit but our wider community.

As many of you may know, the church in Vauxhall was sold a number of years ago and after much prayer, reflection and discernment, there was a decision made for the circuit to keep a presence in that place. So, working with the developer a plan was put in place to create a space within the larger development for the circuit to engage with the community. The project might be about working with those in the community who are at the edges of society for one reason or another and in doing so create a new community with and alongside people from that community. It might be about building stronger relationships with the surrounding communities. It will certainly be about creating a space where everyone can experience God's love in practical ways. Perhaps what the Methodist Church is now calling 'new places for new people' in which new Christian communities are formed with those who may not have been connected with church and faith previously.

Following the visit to the project I realised that we are now at a stage where some decisions need to be made about what this space that has been set aside for the church might look like. What do we need the contractors to put in there now - before it is handed over to us? Where might the toilets and kitchen sensibly be? Should it be divided up in some way now or do we wait until later when we have more of an idea about how the space will be used?

This project isn't something that can be accomplished by just a few; it requires the collective effort of our entire circuit. Each one of

us has something unique to contribute, and together, we can make a lasting difference.

Our community is filled with individuals and families who are struggling—whether it's due to loneliness, financial hardship, or simply the pressures of daily life. As a church, we are called to be a beacon of hope and light. This project is an opportunity to connect with people letting them know that they are seen, loved, and valued. By coming together, we can provide practical help, build relationships, and offer the love of Christ in a tangible way.

I believe that **everyone** in our circuit family has something to offer. Whether you are able to volunteer your time, donate resources, offer your skills, or simply pray for the success of this project, there is a place for you on this team. Here are some ways you can be part of this exciting initiative:

- **Volunteering:** We need people to help organise, plan, and execute different aspects of the project, from community outreach to logistics and event planning.
- **Skills and Talents:** Whether you have experience in community organising, teaching, cooking, administration, or simply offering a listening ear, your gifts are needed!

Revd Lena Ali's Message

I would like to begin by thanking you all for your prayers, support, cards and messages of sympathy following the death of my 34 year old niece Neela in Orlando on the Friday 18th October 2024. She died after a brief illness and we are all trying to come to terms with our loss.

Despite our trials and tribulations, life goes on and once again we have come full circle as we move rapidly to the Church year which begins with the first Sunday of Advent on the 1st December 2024.

The Church year ends on the last Saturday of Ordinary time which falls this year on the 31st November 2024. Advent comes from a Latin word for "coming" and the season of Advent is a time of preparation and expectation for the coming celebration of our Lord's nativity, and for the final coming of Christ "in power and glory."

In the life of the Church, there are 6 seasons: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Ordinary Season. Technically, Ordinary Time has two parts, but it remains one season. The first part begins right after the Feast of the Epiphany and runs until Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday (when Lent begins). The second part begins the Monday after Pentecost and runs until the First Sunday of Advent.

For many people, opportunities to celebrate Advent and Christmas will be denied this year. The Palestinian Christians and other Christians elsewhere in the world continue to live in uncertain and perilous times and it is sad and disheartening that there is so much suffering in the very land where Our Saviour walked, and where prospects of peace seem like a distant dream; there and elsewhere in the world.

It is enough to make us feel downcast, helpless and even hopeless because the way forward seems so unclear.

As many of us will be preparing to celebrate at this sacred time of the year, I pray that our hearts will go out to our unfortunate and suffering sisters and brothers who are facing natural disasters, wars, displacement and so many hardships, too many to name. Their food baskets and stomachs will remain empty.

As we think of the angels on that first Christmas night declaring "peace on earth" and then the star which guided the wisemen, it seems that in the unforeseeable future, the light is hidden. This does not mean there is no hope.

When Christians join together, worship and pray together and pray for justice and peace, it is a sign of hope.

The greatest statement of hope which was ever made was at Christmas, when Jesus came into the world. God reveals himself in Christ, the Word made flesh, the Son of God and Son of Man, and the light of truth is made present amongst us in Christ. Let us celebrate and pray and praise that the presence of Christ amongst us, as God's great gift to the world. The light shines in the darkness.

I sincerely pray and wish that you will all have a Happy and Holy Christmas and the New Year will bring fresh blessings to you and your loved ones.

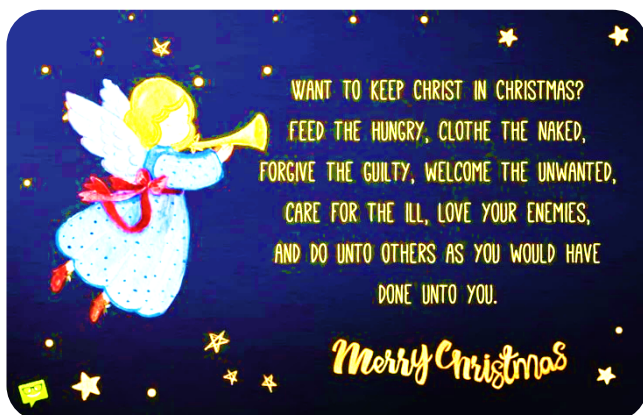
On September 22nd we celebrated Harvest. The service was taken by our minister Rev Sue who told us a story about a homeless lady who found a basket containing ten apples next to her when she woke up. Rev Sue used this story to remind us of all the good things that we have. This homeless woman ate three of the apples, exchanged three for a bed for the night and three for some clothes leaving one apple. What did she decide to do with this one apple? She gave it away! Even in her poverty she was generous to others. Does this remind you of any of the stories or the miracles of Jesus?

Just like with Jesus' parables there are different levels of understanding. We can just think well that a nice story or we can take it to heart and see what this could mean for us.

These are the question the congregation were asked:

- Did you come to church today without any breakfast because there was no food in the house?
- Do you have a spare bedroom in your house?
- Do you have more clothes than will fit into one wardrobe?

Please think about these questions as you remember all that we have and take some action in response to others needs.

Members of the congregation brought Harvest gifts of tinned and packaged goods for those in need. The biscuits, cup a Soup and tea bags have been taken to the Foodbank session at Brixton Hill where they are being used to provide snacks for those who need help. At the session when the goods were taken there were about thirteen single men receiving advice and Food Parcels. These men have been referred by various agencies in Lambeth as being in Food Poverty. Who knows what their back story is but you must be very desperate to be living on the streets or in need of emergency food. The rest of the Harvest donations were taken to the Foodbank Warehouse in Streatham and will be used to make up food parcels for those in need in our borough.

After our Harvest Service we had a Bring and Share lunch in the hall. This was the first time we had done this since before Covid so it was a very happy occasion.

A CHRISTMAS MIRACLE

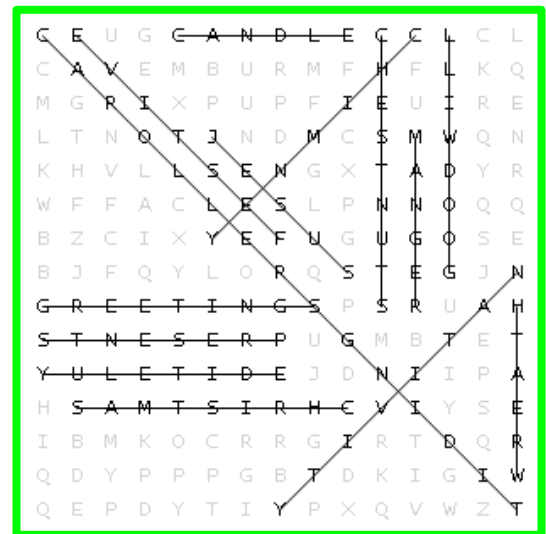
All who are oppressed may come to Him. He is a refuge for them in their times of trouble (Psalm 9:9)

My father was born and spent his first 15 years in the Ukraine. One Christmas his two older brothers bought their parents, a German-made Christmas musical wind-up tree stand. It was mechanical and played *Silent Night*. It brought great joy to this family of ten.

Not long after, the country experienced World War I and then the Russian revolution. Many people endured tremendous persecution - women were raped and fathers were kidnapped and murdered. Thieves arrived at the homes, demanded food and stole whatever they wanted, including the horses.

During one of those raids, God used this Christmas tree stand to perform a miracle and save their lives. It was Christmas Eve and the tree was in the stand playing *Silent Night*. The door burst open and a gang of ruffians stormed in, all holding guns. Fear spread through each family member as they wandered what would happen next. Then, without saying a word they backed out of the house. God used the tree and *Silent Night* to save their lives.

HISTORY OF "LET THERE BE PEACE ON EARTH"

Sy Miller (1908-1971) and his wife Jill Jackson-Miller (1913-1995) collaborated to produce a song that has become a signature composition devoted to world peace and harmony among peoples.

Jill Jackson-Miller (1913 – 1995) was born Evelyn Merchant in Lawrence, Missouri. Jill was three years old when her mother died and was legally adopted by age 12. After a traumatic childhood, she ended up in Hollywood and under several different screen names, appeared in a number of western movies and other productions. When she got married, at her husband's request, she gave up acting to raise a family.

When her first marriage ended, she sought 'peace' through an unsuccessful suicide attempt. In an interview Jill said - "When I attempted suicide [in 1944] and I didn't succeed, I knew for the first time unconditional love—which God is. You are totally loved, totally accepted, just the way you are. In that moment I was not allowed to die, and something happened to me, which is very difficult to explain. I had an eternal moment of truth, in which I knew I was loved, and I knew I was here for a purpose."

Her recovery led to a new, deeply spiritual life. This realization was followed by years of exploring her spiritual nature and her relationship with God. Jill discovered her love for writing, and began writing songs with Sy Miller after they married in 1949.



In 1955 she wrote the lyric of the song and her

The song was introduced at a California retreat to a group of young people who were from a wide variety of religious, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. The couple wrote numerous songs but 'Let there be peace...' is the one that achieved worldwide acclaim and won them many prestigious awards.

The song has been recorded by vocal artists including Tennessee Ernie Ford, Pat Boone, Mahalia Jackson, Johnny Mathis and Placido Domingo.

'Let There Be Peace on Earth and Let It Begin With Me', is an appeal for world peace beginning within each person which helped create a climate for world peace and

understanding. Jill devoted the rest of her life speaking about peace and working toward the cause of world peace. Jill died in 1995, leaving a song which is both personal and dedicated to a better understanding of peace within and of world peace.
